Scoparia Dulcis Linn.

Some remarks on the distribution of this plant appeared on page 57, vol. II of this Journal. A specimen of it has been received from the Garo Hills and it has occurred to me that it would be of interest and of use in tracing the course of dispersal of this alien in India if the abovementioned note were supplemented by a list of the localities in which specimens in the Kew Herbarium have been collected, together with the dates of collection and the elevations. All the specimens are the flower and fruit. The spelling of place-names given on the sheets is retained.
